Parent teacher meetings will take during October. These will be in person or telephone calls and will be 15 minutes in duration.

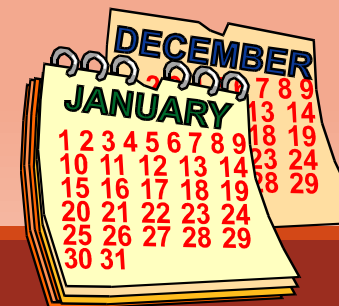

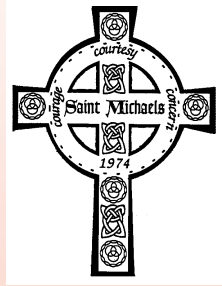

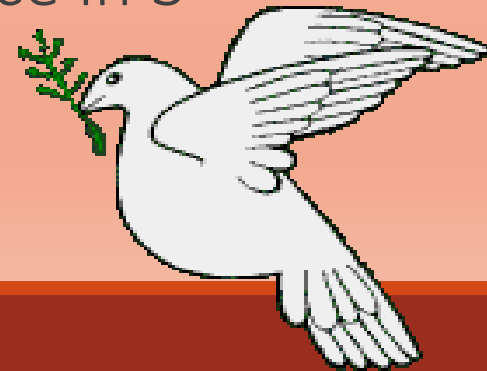
Religion

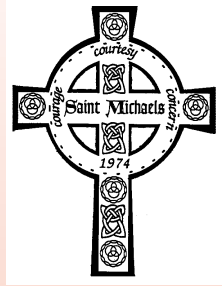

How to help at home

Spend some time each day checking spellings and quick recall of times tables.

Show an interest in what your child is doing in school and talk to them in a positive manner.

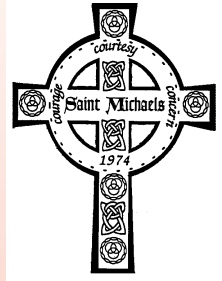
Access online resources to reinforce topics.

Transfer Test SEAG Top Tips

Look back through completed class tests for common question types and recurring topics.

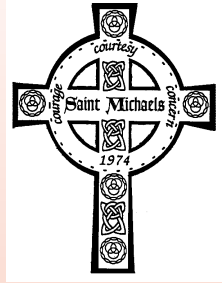
Be aware of areas that need further work and access revision materials.

Read the question carefully – underline key words as you read. The answer is in the text.

Follow the instructions as they are written.

Pay attention to the bold print.

Read the passages before answering questions but check text – don't rely on memory.



Transfer Test Top Tips

Work through the test from start to finish then go back to check over answers.

Make full use of the time – continue checking until the time is up.

Use the working out paper provided.

Complete answer sheet as you do the test.

Be positive and calm – prior to the test relax, have an early night and arrive at school in plenty of time.
